From the Rectory

'To you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord.' Luke 2.11

The Christmas story is a really good read. That's one of the reasons so many people come to church at this magical season. The birth of a baby is always a miracle, but the birth of a child who will change history is very special indeed. The laughter of children is captivating, and, as someone once sang 'Love changes everything'; but discovering that the love, which this child went on to speak about

and live, is at the centre of our existence, well, that's mind-blowing!

I think that everyone can respond with wonder to the Christmas story, and many become more loving people as a result. Trying to put that meaning into words, and finding the right philosophical terms, well that can come later. There's always room in the church for those who want to know more.

Some of these enquirers will say something like, 'I accept that Jesus was a good man, and he taught many wonderful things - but I can't accept that he was Son of God.' Many Christians can sympathize with that position. Week by week, we declare in the creeds that Jesus was the Son of God, but many of us are not quite sure what that means.

We also believe in God the Father, yet we know that God is above and beyond the material world that God created, so God has no body and no gender. In the bad old patriarchal days, men had all the power, so it was natural to use masculine terms when talking about the all - powerful Creator - but inclusive language comes nearer to the reality.

So if you find it difficult to think of Jesus as the Son of God that may be because you have got the wrong idea of Son-ship. Christians believe that Jesus was completely human. But we also believe that the character of God can be fully revealed by a human personality.

The events of the first Christmas are a beautiful story. But they also reveal a central fact of our existence: the reason and purpose of our lives here is love, for love is at the heart of the universe. Happy Christmas, everybody!

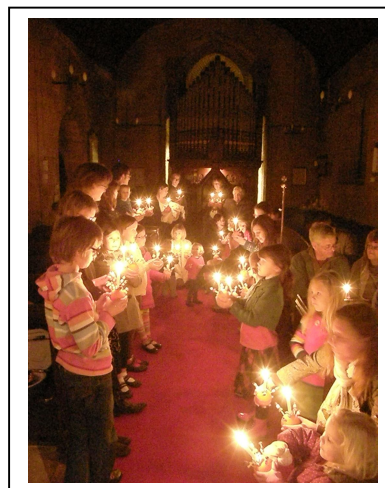

Report on the Parish Council Meetings held 8 and 29 October

FINANCE

The balance of funds as at 29 October is £12,226.85.

PLANNING

B&NES Council's Planning Decisions

Land Opposite Tunley Farm House, Tunley - Approval of reserved matters of the details of layout, scale, appearance and landscaping with regards to application for the erection of two live/work buildings and re-alignment of the highway. APPROVED. While the parish council expressed its concern about the resulting narrowing of the highway our comments were not taken into account as the case officer stated that this type of condition should have been covered in the original outline application.

Approval Reserved Matters Highfield House, Tunley Road, Tunley, Bath BA2 8BE (Highway Farm) Erection of four detached dwellings following the demolition of existing buildings – APPROVED. This was supported by the parish council at its planning meeting on 8 October.

Tyning House, Tunley, Bath Erection of a single storey dwelling and garage following demolition of existing Garage – PENDING DECISION

AGRN Parcel 2400 Fosseyway Englishcombe Bath Construction of agricultural track on land adjoining the A367 (Resubmission) – Full planning Application Not Required. Dunkerton

Parish Council's comments on the highway safety issue have been noted by B&NES.

Local Green Space Nominations

Dunkerton Cricket Ground, Dunkerton Green, Manders Orchard, the Millennium Wood and Tunley Recreation Centre having been previously nominated by the parish council will go before the B&NES Cabinet for approval pending inclusion in the B&NES Draft Placemaking Plan. **Post Meeting update** - unfortunately due to national government planning guidance as these spaces are already in the Green Belt they cannot be designated local green spaces so won't be included in the draft placemaking plan.

Planning Application The Hermitage Dunkerton Erection of new double garage and porch with associated courtyard alterations for improved parking - The parish council unanimously supported this application as it complies with the relevant policies in the core strategy.

HIGHWAYS, RIGHTS OF WAY AND ALLIED MATTERS

Tunley Fork (A3667 / B3115 Junction – The field hedge on the A367 below the "Dunkerton" sign has been cut and drivers waiting to turn right onto the B3115 when coming home from Bath can now see what traffic is coming up the hill towards them.

Surface Water on Withyditche Lane Below Engine Bridge – B&NES Highways Inspector has said that the natural spring hasn't been causing water to flow over the road during the summer so he will wait and see what happens in the winter,.

B3115 Bloomfield Place – Drain to the West of number 3 is blocked – the Highways Inspector has said that as there have been no reports of the road flooding so this will have to wait until the scheduled annual drain clearance.

B3115 Bloomfield Place - Bend warning sign on the Bath direction side of the road just past number 1 Bloomfield - the sign needs replacing, the Highways Inspector did issue a works order for a replacement sign but apparently the order has got lost so the inspector will order it again.

B3115 Tunley, surface condition of carriageway and pavements – A review/survey of the condition of the carriageway surface in the vicinity of the Blind Lane junction and of the

condition of the pavements throughout the village will be undertaken by Cllrs Prescott and Patch.

B3115 Replacement Road Markings Following Surface Dressing – The Highways Inspector has been told that the replacement “Slow” road markings as you approach John Bull House going from Bath towards Tunley and both sides of North Hill Crossroads have been missed. He also knows that the yellow line markings on both sides of North Hill Crossroads and Bloomfield Terrace have also been missed.

B3115 Reflectors (Cats Eyes) – Replaced at last after umpteen times of asking.

The Hollow – The drain just above Manor Farm still continues to block after heavy rain, the Highways Inspector says he will continue to look into it!!!!

Tunley to Overdale Footpath Scheme – Some good news at last - Martin, David Veale and Chris Taylor Chair of Camerton Parish Council recently met Tony Clarke, the B&NES Cabinet Member for Highways on site and we understand that as a result we can expect significant progress. Cllr David Veale is in the process of finalising negotiations and will shortly be circulating a news release to Tunley residents.

Stoneage Lane Planters – Geoff Skyrme has single handedly cleared out and generally tidied up the planters for the winter, Geoff reports that the daffs are already beginning to show through. John Walford cut the grass when Geoff had finished and it all looks very tidy. A big thank you to Geoff and John for all their efforts and hard work.

Update Rights of Way Matters:

The Public Rights of Way Officer from B&NES has had the gate at the entrance to the footpath on the bridge in Stoneage Lane turned round as it was so high that walkers were having difficulties climbing over it. Steps have also appeared at the gateway of the footpath by Elm Tree House, previously known as Canal Cottage, in Stoneage Lane but have been put in the wrong place! They were meant to have been installed inside the stile opposite the Chapel in Withyditch, but instructions were misread. Hopefully this will be rectified within the next couple of weeks with new steps also being installed at Withyditch, a mistake that will lead to a good result for us as we will then have two new sets of steps. The Public Rights of Way Officer is getting a project together during the

winter months to bid for capital money to carry out rights of way work at Tunley Equestrian Centre. Cllr Patch, Erica and Cllr Prescott are going on a footpath foray at the beginning of November (weather permitting) to replace footpath signs that have become lost. If any of the dog walkers are aware of any missing signs perhaps they could let Cllr Prescott know so that we can rectify the situation. We understand from the B&NES Rights of Way Officer that she is following up on a situation regarding what appears to be an electric fence across the access to the kissing gate in the bottom South West corner of the field below the TRC meadow.

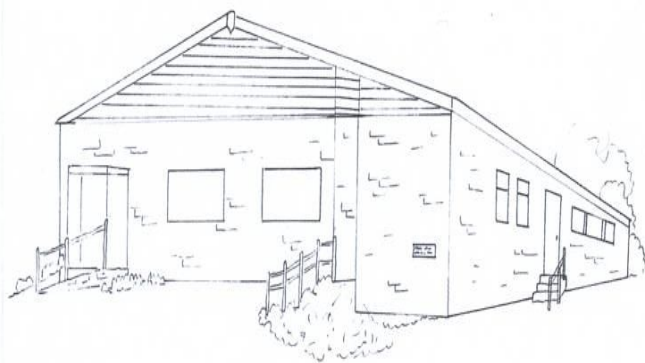
Review of Street Lighting in Tunley: A year ago some of the new style LED street lights in the centre of Tunley were changed for ones giving a higher output. Only four lights were changed at the time for a trial 12 month period. Parishioners at the meeting expressed interest in getting the remaining lights changed. The parish council will therefore progress this.

Review of Tunley Traffic Calming: The parish council has received a petition signed by forty four residents requesting the installation of traffic speed tables to replace the current traffic calming measures. After a very constructive debate it was agreed that a working party would be set up of residents to progress this issue. This working group will therefore canvass views of the parishioners living in Tunley and then produce a report for submission to BANES outlining the problems with the current traffic calming measures and possible solutions. The parish council unanimously agreed to support the residents working group on this matter.

Progress Report Changing the Parish Council Name: The change of name to Dunkerton and Tunley Parish Council will go before a meeting of BANES Council on the 12 November for authorisation.
